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


Today

- No recognition of nurse specialist in Europe, no mention of nurse Specialist in the directive 2013/55/EU



Outcomes

- Need of recognition of nurse specialists at master level able to set a diagnosis, to prescribe, to make research
 - No dissociation between research and practice otherwise danger to create a gap between resarch and practice. Useless and costly
 - NS don't replace doctors, another profession between GCN and medical specialist
- Need of an harmonisation of the practice in form of CTF in order to permit an automatic recognition of the qualification of the nurse specialist and free mobility within the European MS
