Biography: Dr Daniela Lehwaldt is a Registered General Nurse (RGN), Registered Nurse Tutor (RNT), Senior Fellow of Advance HE (SFAHE) and Certified Global Nurse Consultant (CGFNS). She holds a Bachelor in Nursing Studies (BNS), Masters in Science in Education (MScEd) and a PhD in Nursing.

She is the Chair of the International Council of Nurses (ICN) Nurse Practitioner (NP) / Advanced Practice Nurse (APN) Network. She was a Nurse Practitioner in Cardiothoracic Surgery before taking up her current role as Associate Professor at the School of Nursing, Psychotherapy and Community Health at Dublin City University (DCU) in Ireland.

She has published widely on the topic of nurse education, advanced nursing and digital health education. She is President of the Subgroup 'International' at the German Network Deutsches Netzwerk APN & ANP g.e.V. Daniela is a founding member of the Ireland-Africa Alliance for Non-Communicable Diseases (IAAfNCDs).

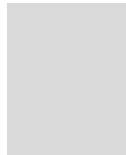

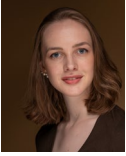

Dr. E. Cabrera began her professional career in 1988, assuming the role of clinical nurse at Santa Creu i Sant Pau Hospital in Barcelona. In 1994, she relocated to the United States, joining the faculty of the Department of Gynecology and Obstetrics at the University of Nebraska Medical Center in Omaha, Nebraska. During her tenure in the U.S., she earned certification as a ChildBirth Educator and delved into research focusing on the needs of the Hispanic community in Omaha.

Upon returning to Spain in 1997, she assumed the role of a researcher at the Research Foundation of Sant Pau Hospital, contributing to a project within the 5th Framework Program of the European Union, in collaboration with the University of Turku, Finland. In 1998, she joined the faculty of the School of Health Sciences at the International University of Catalonia (IUC),

initially as an associate professor and later, in 2000, as a lecturer professor. In this capacity, she spearheaded innovative educational initiatives for undergraduate and postgraduate training within the Department of Nursing, culminating in her appointment as the Director of the Official master's degree in nursing sciences at IUC. During this period, she also completed her degree in Humanities and her Ph.D., tailored for professionals in Primary Care, under the auspices of the Department of Medicine at the International University of Catalonia.

In 2010, she assumed the position of Dean of the School of Health Sciences at TecnoCampus Foundation, affiliated with Pompeu Fabra University. Subsequently, she served as the Director of the School of Health Sciences until 2019, when she assumed the Directorship of the Chair on Aging and Quality of Life at TecnoCampus and took on the academic leadership of the master's degree in integrated care in Chronicity and Aging at Pompeu Fabra University. During this period, she collaborated as an external professor with the Department of Care Management and Social Work at the Sechenov First Moscow State Medical University, Russia.

In her research endeavors, Dr. E. Cabrera actively participated as a researcher in more than ten national and international projects focusing on aging and caregivers. She has coordinated 2 European Erasmus plus projects and several from Spanish national Ministry of Health and Science. She has been coordinator since 2017 of a Consolidated Research Group in "Chronicity Care and Innovation in Health (GRACIS)" until the present, with a significant multidisciplinary research group of phycologist, physicians, nurses, social workers ,physiotherapist..

She serves as an evaluator of several agencies of the Ministry of Health of Spain and contributes as a panelist in the evaluation of COST projects (European Cooperation in Science and Technology) for the European Commission. She holds accreditation as a Full Professor by ANECA and has held the distinction of a professor (advanced research) since 2017 by the Agency for the Quality of the University System of Catalonia (AQU). Since 2010, she has been honored as a Fellow of the European Academy of Nursing Science (EANS) and has presided over 6 years the international network Udine-C Network (Understanding Development Issues in Nurse Educator Careers). Recognized with three six-year research periods (AQU) and five in teaching activity since 2013.

Currently, she holds the position of principal investigator of a European project "4D in the Digitalization of learning in practice placement" from European Commission €370,000 in funding, in collaboration with various European nations and the national project "Aging and Loneliness. The feminization of unwanted loneliness in elderly people; how to face it. €100,600 in funding. As a results of this projects, she has overseen the successful completion of 10 doctoral theses and 11 master's theses.

Reflecting her scholarly output, her engagement in European projects, and her stewardship of doctoral theses in recent years, she has authored 62 articles within the domain of Social and Health Sciences, with 57 featured in JCR, 25 within the first quartile, 10 in Q2, 13 in Q3, and 9 in Q4. Notably, many of these contributions have garnered a significant volume of citations (871 in total) within their respective disciplines, further attested by an h-index of 18.

Now in WHO Headquarter, she is project manager for Universal Health Coverage and Life course division and she is leading an innovative incubator Art Impact For Health and SDGs to grow art and culture within the medical environment as an innovative strategy to build resilient individuals, communities, and health systems, creating a global creative and organic community movement that advances the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and Health for All. Previously she have supported cross-cutting areas like palliative care, health care innovation, engagement (from patient to community) in the context of Integrated People Centered Health Services, partnerships through linguistic collaborations mechanisms to contribute to Health Information For All. She is the moderator of the international francophone forum on Health Information For All.

Previously in WHO, she was a project and communication manager of EVIPNet (Evidence Informed Policy Network) at the Knowledge Ethic and Research Department designing and bringing to life its social network, particularly in African countries for helping policy-makers to make better decisions based on evidence and to establish sustainable partnerships and collaboration with large range of stakeholders. She had worked for the UNECE Sustainable Energy Division involved in the implementation of the UNDA Project on enhanced energy services for pro-poor areas through PPP in renewable energy and at the same time adviser to Economic Cooperation and Integration Division on establishing UNECE International PPP Specialist Centre of Excellence on Health in Manila Philippines and others PPP Specialist Centre of Excellence in Institutional and Legal Concession- PPP in France and in Renewable energy in Morocco.

Previously in the private sector, she was Director of the Knowledge Management Department of Vivendi Universal Corporate in Paris to develop and promote an interactive intranet to establish

synergies between business-units for all Vivendi Group subsidiaries (Vivendi Universal and Vivendi Environment).

WHO's Art Impact for Health and SDGs Initiative
Art is an integral part of me, it is a path of life based on the recognition and appreciation of our creativity. Giving meaning, poetry and beauty in this world, it is a breath that facilitates the celebration of life and joy in everyday life. Art is the expression of creativity that allows us to know ourselves more and more deeply and to share. Dancing, playing music, singing, sculpting, painting, writing poetry etc. Art is also a practice that helps to maintain a connection with nature and the essence of creation. I was able to rediscover the power of art when my husband died and turn this tragedy into a hymn to life and to bringing out the best in ourselves. I am now on a quest to reach out to the world and engage other artists, entrepreneurs, researchers and visionaries to realize the importance of each person's potential. This quest is based on the meaning of existence at the deepest level (where we come from, what we do and with what quality of intention and where we are going) combining the arts accentuates communication and interaction. I discovered this gradually during artistic exchanges when using my art in my work at WHO on health and the Sustainable Development Goals. On an international or local level, I have rediscovered its phenomenal power to put collective intelligence into action. I see a similarity with a conductor who integrates and amalgamates all the disciplines and expertise of each person. Art brings a humanistic and benevolent vision.

I have produced series of International art exhibits and art expression workshops to support countries. International art exhibitions were able to identify and present a retrospective of a set of initiatives, both individual and collective at the global level, demonstrating through artistic representations and testimonies of resilience journeys how art can impact the meaning of life, the notion of well-being. The aspect relating to social support for the most vulnerable and marginalized people in local communities has allowed to federate in practice an approach consisting in 'leaving no one behind'. These exhibition have demonstrated how multidisciplinary artistic humanist approaches can be combined in the fields of health, education, and social entrepreneurship.
