# WHY NRC WAS ESTABLISHED?

International quality accreditation programs, such as The Magnet Recognition Program, require that evidence-based practice (EBP) is implemented.



However, EBP in healthcare is not yet implemented as expected, and there is unjustified variation in practices between different units and professionals.

> The implementation of EBP requires both systematic application of existing evidence and producing new evidence, as well as visible contributions to the nursing science.

> > Therefore, nursing research centers have been established to hospital organizations globally to promote EBP.



- Achieving strategic priorities of HUS and implementing the health sciences research program
- International accreditation projects, such as the Magnetic Hospital Accreditation

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### OTHER ACTIVITIES – SOME EXAMPLES

- Coordinating the network for PhD-students
- Coordinating the network for PhD's with a nursing (or responding) background
- Providing consultations in different study phases
- Supervising PhD and master students
- Preparing study permissions (nursing science, HUS-level)
- Organising educations to support research competence
- Representing nursing science in HUS Research Committee, HUS Ethical Committee, and HUS Patient and Public Research Panel

#### SOME EXAMPLES



- Establishing a research project with a focus on exploring the outcomes of evidencebased practices
- Coordinating national benchmarking of nursing-sensitive outcomes (15 organisations); incl. a multicentre research project
- Coordinating national benchmarking network for quality of the student supervision
- Coordinating the networks of HUS Clinical Nurse Specialists and HUS Clinical Nurse Educators
- Providing an on-line course of researchbased development for clinical nurses



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- Since 2019, NRC has provided consultation assistance for the planning and implementation of several research and researchbased development projects which have aimed to improve clinical education
  - for example, establishing and evaluating a practice to transition program for nurses and a competency framework for clinical nurse educators.





NRC has **provided resources** (between 2019-2024) for research **by granting a total of 28.5 research months** to doctoral researchers (**n=6**) who were/are conducting educational research.
