Established in 1995, FINE is dedicated to advancing nursing education across Europe. FINE provides a platform for educators to exchange knowledge, share best practices, and collaborate on innovations in nursing science. By gathering data and fostering dialogue, FINE supports evidence-based policy-making within the EU and promotes the integration of nursing education into higher education systems. Committed to excellence, FINE works to enhance the quality and impact of nursing education across Europe.

This strategic plan reinforces FINE's leadership in nursing education across Europe, ensuring that nursing education remains high-quality, harmonised, and adaptable, thus, future-ready. By enhancing nurse educators training, research capacity, clinical education, and international collaboration, FINE strengthens the nursing workforce's ability to meet the evolving health needs of populations.

The FINE Strategic Plan for Nursing Education in Europe (2025–2035) includes:

1. PROMOTING EXCELLENCE IN NURSING EDUCATION

FINE is committed to ensuring high-quality, evidence-based, and future-oriented nursing education by:

- Strengthening the preparation of nurse educators, supporting their pedagogical development, and promoting ongoing continuing education.
- Aligning nursing education with the European Qualifications Framework (EQF) and Bologna Process, ensuring a structured continuum of education from bachelor's to doctoral level.
- Promoting competency-based and technology-enhanced teaching methods, including simulation, virtual and augmented reality, digital learning platforms, and Al-driven education tools.



2. STRENGTHENING THE STATUS OF NURSING SCIENCE IN EUROPEAN HIGHER EDUCATION

To consolidate nursing education as an essential component of European universities, FINE aims to:

- Harmonise nursing curricula across Europe, ensuring mobility, fair recognition, and consistent quality standards.
- Promote a standardised framework for specialist and advanced practice nursing roles (EQF level 7 and beyond) to establish clear professional pathways.
- Advocate for nursing science as a recognised and independent scientific discipline, with a strong foundation in research and evidence-based practice.
- Support doctoral education (EQF 8) in nursing sciences, strengthening research capacity and academic excellence.
- Ensure that nursing curricula are responsive to contemporary healthcare challenges, including public health crises, climate-related impacts, and digital transformation.





3. ENHANCING THE VALUE AND VISIBILITY OF NURSING IN EUROPE

FINE is dedicated to promoting nursing education and practice as an essential pillar of healthcare by:

- Advocating for a European consensus on the added value of nurses, ensuring fair recognition and integration into healthcare policies.
- Promoting the academic, professional, and social recognition of nursing as a cornerstone of the European healthcare system.
- Empowering nursing educators and strengthening academic career pathways, ensuring that nursing educators have structured opportunities for career progression, leadership roles, and research engagement.
- Recognising the complementarity between nursing educators and healthcare professionals, fostering stronger collaboration between academia and clinical practice to enhance education quality and workforce preparedness.
- Supporting public awareness campaigns to enhance the image of nursing and attract new professionals.

4. REPRESENTING THE INTERESTS OF NURSING STUDENTS AND EDUCATORS

FINE ensures that the voices of students and educators shape the future of nursing education by:

- Facilitating dialogue, exchange, and collaboration among students, educators, and institutions across Europe.
